This book provides a detailed account of the lives of the poor, particularly their use of social networks to

Particular focus is given to the complicated nature of social relationships, the different contexts where these relationships take place, and how these factors shape poor individuals' decisions regarding whom to turn to when attempting to meet their needs, including how they actually meet those needs.
